



### Could This Be a Rare 4x4 FF Ford

Could a super rare Formula Ferguson (FF) Ford Mustang have found its way to a classified ad in the Netherlands? The owners of 27 years say, yes; however, we remain skeptical. Let's investigate...

In the early 1960's the Ferguson P99 Formula One racecar would win the Oulton Park race running a four-wheel drive system. In 1964, Ford was wanting to expand on the new and popular Mustang, from potentially building four-door models to four-wheel drive models. As a result of the latter, Harry Ferguson would take a crack at applying his FF system to a Mustang. It is well documented that the company would imply their FF system on a Mustang at Ferguson Research Ltd. in England. In fact, two 1964 hardtop Mustangs were sent over, one to be modified and one to serve as a control. Due to fear of the production cost being too high the idea was nixed and the prototype, and only documented FF Ford Mustang, would find its way to the Tampa Bay Automobile Museum in 2009.

This alleged FF is a 1970 convertible, about as opposite as you can get from the known FF in Tampa. Due to the fact that Ford scrapped the FF Mustang idea years before this car was even built would indicate that it is not an authentic FF. However, without looking through all of Ferguson Research Ltd.'s projects there is no way to be one-hundred that maybe they didn't do one more later on for a customer or friend. And if one were to resurface it would almost certainly be in Europe, as this one is.

Here's some 2018 Mustang trivia: Do you know why the new push-button start button pulses 30 times a minute? That's because it matches the resting heartbeat of a real mustang pony. Among the many updates on the 2018 Mustang, the start button pulses red when the door is unlocked and until the engine is started, giving the Mustang a heartbeat of sorts. At a rate of 30 beats per minute, the start button mirrors the resting heart rate of a real pony. The new ignition button is one of many changes customers will see when the 2018 Mustang reaches showrooms this fall. Other highlights include a 12-inch all-digital, customizable instrument cluster, an available 10 -speed automatic transmission, and a redesigned front and rear end.

This is the time of the year when the MCA Nominating Committee accepts submissions for positions on the National Board of Directors of the Mustang Club of America. We are represented all around the world by different Mustang clubs and that number continues to grow. We are hereby seeking hard-working, dedicated men and women who want to become part of this great team by running for a position on the Board. You might ask, Why me? So I'll ask you, Why not? I asked the same question also and I'm glad I did. Don't be afraid to jump in and get your feet wet. It is so worthwhile. At the end of December 2017, several of our current directors terms will expire. It's time to submit your name and a short Bio for nomination to one of these positions.

You must be a current member in good standing of the MCA and 18 years of age before October 1, 2017, to serve on the Board of Directors. 

### San Antonio Mustang Club History

This month's history I am featuring some articles written by Jack Klug that were printed in past editions of Hoofprints. First one is Jack's story about the 25th Anniversary of SAMC (2 pages). Next ones are Part 2 and Part 3 of "Decoding Your Mustang Warranty Plate" (4 pages). Last one is Jack's article about Mustang Literature (1 page).

### SAN ANTONIO MUSTANG CLUB'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY

Twenty-five years ago this month, February 1980, I was scanning the classified section of the newspaper and ran across a very small ad inviting anyone interested in forming a Mustang club to come to some pizza place out by Lackland AFB. It was bitter cold and windy, so Barb decided to stay home with the kids. I drove our silver blue 65 coupe, my daily driver for 15 years, out to the meeting and found about 25-30 Mustang enthusiasts. The only people I remember were Mark Cumberland(now co-owner of Alamo Classic Mustang), Lee Roy Meadows(co-owner of B&M Automotive), and Rusty Mahan(local car icon known by most car enthusiasts. The meeting was called by Tom Johnson(now Kubler) and an older couple whose name is long gone.

Another meeting was set later in the month at North Star Mall by the boots(picture on left). It was better weather so the large crowd got to kick tires, visit, and come up with the name for the club. The first meetings were at Shakey's Pizza on San Pedro. Over the years we met at 3 or 4 pizza places(and were probably responsible for shutting Shakey's down), Shoneys, Ryan's Family Steakhouse, the Blue Ribbon Grill, Mike's Sports Bar, and a number of other places. The first elected officers were Mark Cumberland, President; Tom Murray(now General Sales Manager at Jordan Ford), Vice President; Kathy Angell, Secretary; and Jack Klug, Treasurer(surprise). Dues were set at \$2.00 a month, and yearly dues was not an option until 1981. Mark Cumberland and I starting putting together a newsletter, which we set up as 6 times a year not monthly(not enough information to do a monthly). We only did one issue, December 1981, before Ray and Barb Smith joined the club and took over. Barb Klug won a contest naming the newsletter. The club logo, which we still use, was designed by Tom Johnson(Kubler).



Early activities were met with tremendous enthusiasm and always produced good turnouts. We did not put on our own Mustang show until March 1983(at Bob's Mustang Parts in Universal City), but we attended all the local rod runs and South Texas Truckers shows. We had a volley ball team that competed against other car clubs; we had a baseball team which played the Camaro Club one time and then disbanded, we bowled, and we attended the Texas State Shelby meet, usually held in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area(but 1 in Waco, 1 in College Station, and 1 in San Antonio) beginning in October 1980. The state Shelby meet, later called the Texas Nationals, was run by Rusty and Earlene Mahan and William and Freda Guyon. They did everything and then relied on volunteers to help with the racing on Saturday and car show on Sunday. Usually the headquarters was at a small motel, and the Mustang groups took over the entire place. Tire kicking was a favorite sport at the motel, usually helped along with a few beers. Normally the club took 10-15 cars to the event.

### San Antonio Mustang Club History

This was a very exciting time. I saw cars I had not even heard of or seen. Mark Cumberland had 2 Shelbys. Another member, Jerry Nassar, had 3 Shelbys. Sidney Perales, who now owns a local limo service, had a California special. But at the Shelby meet you saw every kind of Shelby, every kind of Cobra, Panteras, and every possible kind of Mustang. A well-to-do Dallas area guy, Rick Nagel, was putting together a Shelby Museum and was buying all the rare early cars: Cobras, Cobra Daytona Coupe, GT 40, Thunderbolt, Tigers, and Falcons. Carroll Shelby donated some of his collection to Nagel, and Rick would get his friends to bring out many of his cars—and many were raced. Unfortunately the Shelby museum never was built. Financial problems and some illegal stuff, according to rumor, destroyed his dream. Carroll Shelby's cars were taken back, and many of the other cars were sold.

Four other highlights of those early years are worth mentioning. In January 1982 our club went to Austin to participate in the Mustang Owners Club of Austin's "Parade of Ponies." (picture to right) They were a new club like us, and it was the beginning of a long-term relationship with them. Between the two clubs, we must have had around 40 cars that paraded throughout Austin and then met at a local Ford dealership.

Another important and memorable highlight was our involvement in the Hill Country Swap Meet and Car Display with the Vintage Car Club of Fredericksburg. In July 1982 a number of club members went to that swap meet to set up a car display. After talking with members of the Fredericksburg club, most notably Charlie and Vivian Keeling, and Stan and Rose Young, we were invited to help put on the swap meet the next year. We accepted. From 1983-1994 our Club spent the last weekend in July in Fredericksburg handling the concessions at the swap meet for a 40% share of the profits. And profitable it was. The first year we only made \$220 but in 1994 we made almost \$3900.

The third highlight of the early years was the Texas Auto Club Council(TACC), a San Antonio organization of car clubs. It was a great idea and a lot of fun. Each year, beginning in 1983 we had a giant picnic with all the clubs and a number of years we set up club displays at the Convention Center for our annual car show. Mike Frazier designed a number of great displays for the club. Unfortunately TACC only lasted a few years.

The last highlight of the early continues to this day. In 1984 the club decided to begin supporting a local charity. We began with Elf Louise for a 5 years, and in 1991 we were introduced to a new charity, Dare to Love, which we support to this day. Since 1984 our club has donated \$23,824.45 to a variety of charities, something we can be very proud of.

As you can see, I could go on forever—but I won't. If you are interested in the early history of the Club, come by my house sometime and look through my 7 giant picture albums or talk with some of the long-time members—Mark Cumberland, Tom Murray, Ray Smith, Mike Frazier, Harry Burke, or Leon Weinstrom . It has been fun, and I look forward to the future of our Club.





## BASIC MUSTANG LITERATURE

Like everything else Mustang, the amount of books available is overwhelming. If you don't believe me, get hold of a <u>Classic Motorbooks</u> catalog sometime. They list over 100 books on Mustangs: books on history, books on restoration, books on performance, and specialized books on Boss 302's, Boss 429's, and Shelbys. It's downright intimidating (and expensive).

If you have unlimited funds, buy them all. If you don't you obviously need to be selective. Since most of us are primarily interested in keeping our cars running (service) and fixing them up (restoration), I would like to recommend a basic library, one that can be assembled for about \$65.00 to \$85.00.

- The factory service manual for your year car. All years are available for about \$29.00 unless you are fortunate enough to have a 1969 or 1971-3. The comprehensive Ford 5-volume sets run \$60.00.
- 2) The glovebox owner's manual (about \$6.75). It's a heck of a lot easier to find a spark plug gap or other general service information in here than it is to find it in the service manual:
- 3) How to Restore Your Mustang (about \$14.95). This Mustang Monthly publication of about 160 pages takes you through the disassembly, cleaning, refinishing, and reassembly of an early Mustang. It even has sections in the back on decoding data plates, paint codes, interior codes, engine colors, tire size, placement of engine decals, and list of attaching parts' colors (black or natural). Lots of useful information and illustrations.
- 4) Mustang How-To, volumes 1 and 2. (about \$6.95 each). Even if you have the original articles in the magazines, these two handy volumes are collections of Mustang Monthly "how-to" articles for 1964½ to 1973 Mustangs. Volume 1 (25 articles) includes information on refinishing the engine compartment, improving handling, fixing squeaking upper control art bushings, keeping your car running cool, repairing leaky cowl panels, fixing air conditioning, refinishing styled steel wheels, replacing bushings in the transmission shifter, converting idiot lights to gauges, replacing your interior, replacing a headliner, repairing door hinges, installing a carpet, etc. Volume 2 (19 articles) includes information on restoring consoles, rebuilding topleader transmissions, installing rally-pacs, replacing vinyl tops, replacing timing chains, preserving your original alternator case, etc.
- A subscription to <u>Mustang Monthly</u> magazine (\$19.97). This is a quality publication which continues to provide diverse, useful information.

Many of you long-time Mustang enthusiasts are already familiar with these publications, but I hope this information is useful for any newcomers. If it is, cruise out to Alamo Classic Mustang; they carry all the ones I mentioned.







#### Which Oil?

"Which Oil" by Jack Klug (reprinted from an old Hoofprints newsletter)

Most car enthusiasts have their favorite brand of car oil and probably remain faithful to it, for whatever reason, regardless of price. Well, what if a comprehensive study demonstrated that basically what oil you use doesn't make any difference? Would you change allegiance to your brand if you could get something cheaper?

The July 1996 <u>Consumer Reports</u> article, "The Surprising Truth about Motor Oils," presents the results of a comprehensive test of 75 New York City taxi cabs who drove four and a half million miles in 22 months. The test placed identically rebuilt motors (GM V-6's) with precisely measured parts in each cab and tested the performance of 20 popular motor oils meeting the industry's latest standards as certified by a star-burst symbol on the container. They also had the oil's chemical and physical properties analyzed by an independent lab. Oil was changed every 6,000 miles. After 60,000 miles, the engines were taken apart and checks for wear and harmful deposits.

RESULTS: Of the 20 oils tested plus 2 synthetics (Mobil I and Penzoil Performax) and one synthetic-and-conventional blend (Valvoline Durablend), every oil performed well. Thorough statistical analysis showed that no brand - not even the expensive synthetics - was meaningfully better or worse. There were some observations:

- 1. Mobil I and Penzoil Performax synthetics flowed exceptionally well at low temperatures.
- 2. Some automakers recommended specific brands. You may need to follow these recommendations to keep a new car in warranty.
- 3. There was no meaningful difference on the engines whose oil was changed at 3000 miles and those changed at 6000. People who change oil every 3000 miles may be wasting money. Modern oils don't need to be changed as often as oils did years ago. But don't stretch the change interval beyond the automobile manufacturer's recommendation, no matter what oil you use.
- 4. Slick 50, STP Engine Treatment, and STP Oil Treatment provide no discernable benefits.
- 5. Synthetics were no better than regular oils except as noted in #I above.

I would highly recommend the article since I have just provided an overview of the actual contents.

### ~ TRAVELER'S CORNER ~

Reprinted from an old Hoofprints Newsletter. No Author was noted on the article.

Park Road 337 to Lost Maples State Park and Leakey, TX; Approximately 2.5 hrs (one way and straight through); Approximately 90 Miles from Helotes.

This has to be one of the most beautiful drives in Texas (definitely near San Antonio.) Follow Hwy 16 North to the town of Bandera. The highway takes a right turn (follow the signs). Next town is Medina. Stop in at the Apple Store on Hwy 16 for cider and other goodies. Take a left on Park Rd 337. The Medina River follows the road on your left. The road gets really curvy and you begin to get into some serious hills before you reach Vanderpool. Be sure and drive slow—not only because of the hairpin turns, but also to give you time to take in the scenery (at least for the passengers!) At Vanderpool, turn right onto 187. To get to Lost Maples Park, continue North on 187 about 2 miles. To get to Leakey, continue on 187 until the intersection of the western limb of Park Rd 337. Turn left onto 337. The scenery on the west side of 187 is just as nice as the east side. Before entering Leakey, you will cross over the Frio River. Stop and see how clear and feel how cold the water is. Continue on to Leakey. For those who wish to see Garner State Park, turn left onto 336 in Leakey. The park is about 10 miles south of the intersection of 336 and 337.


